

Age

Drivers ages 17-21 continue to have the highest rates of crash involvement, injuries to themselves and others and deaths of others. Drivers age 80 and older have the highest rates of driver deaths.

Drivers ages 60-69 were the safest drivers by most measures examined.

Penalty Points

Penalty points remain on your licence for three years from the date of conviction – though you can't have them removed until their fourth anniversary.

The points are cumulative. You will be disqualified if you receive 12 in a three-year period. New drivers will be banned if they receive six points within two years of passing their test.

Years of Driving

Over one in five (21.6%) new drivers had been involved in an accident during their first year of driving. 26.12% of new drivers aged between 18 and 24 have an accident in their first year.

27.7% of new drivers aged between 25 and 34. With these percentages falling further with more years experience

Business Miles

Drivers whose business journeys account for up to 80 per cent of their total mileage have 13 per cent more accidents than non-work drivers.

Almost one quarter (23 per cent) of drivers with business mileage drove more than 80 per cent of their mileage on these journeys.
